

**RESOLUTION NO. 19-34**

**Draper City's Clean Air Initiative. Idle Free Restrictions.**

**WHEREAS**, Draper City acknowledges idling vehicles emit particulate matter that when inhaled, may cause serious health conditions; and

**WHEREAS**, Draper City is committed to working with the State of Utah and other Cities in reducing vehicle emissions; and

**WHEREAS**, Draper City desires to educate the public to the harmful effects of idling vehicles, and foster collaboration in addressing clean air issues; and

**WHEREAS**, the Draper City Council hereby finds this action to be in the best interest of the public's health, safety and general welfare.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF DRAPER CITY, STATE OF UTAH, AS FOLLOWS:**

**Section 1.** No driver should allow a vehicle's engine to idle on public property or on private property open to the public within the corporate limits of Draper City for more than two minutes except in extenuating situations where health and safety is a concern.

**Section 2.** Draper City will collaborate with all schools, located in within city boundaries, in developing an education program to inform parents of the consequences of idling cars. Idle free zones will be encouraged at all Draper school locations.

**Section 3.** Draper City will use the appropriate public forums to help educate all community members to the harmful effects of idling cars.

**Section 4.** This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage.
